
New membership booklets were handed out at the March meeting and will also be given out at the April meeting. Any remaining booklets will be mailed to members in mid- April.

RMC Golf is here! The first of five events scheduled for this spring will be played at the Brookside Club in Bourne on Monday April 23rd. If you haven't registered to play, now's the time to do it. Your completed Registration Form and the \$15 registration fee for each event you want to play must be submitted by April 7th. The cost of each event is just \$55 (registration fee is included). Complete details of all five tournaments and the Registration Form are included in this Newsletter.

The final event of the Spring season will be played at the Captains Golf Course in Harwich on May 21st and will include a "golfers lunch" of barbequed burgers, dogs, chips and a desert at the end of play. Lunch will be in the private Pavilion room. A cash bar will be available.

Formats for the events are generally well understood. Play at Blue Rock will Team Greenies – which is a slight modification from normal quota scoring.

Here's how Team Greenie scoring works: A greenie occurs when a player's tee shot finishes on the green in regulation. A greenie is worth 1 point. An additional 1 point is awarded for making par (2 points all together). An Additional 2 points for making a birdie (3 points all together). Four points for a hole-in-one (but no additional point for a greenie). No points for bogey or above but can still get the 1 point for a greenie. Scoring will be based around 18 points. For example, if a player has a 9 handicap, he will begin at minus nine points. If that player makes a par (2 points—one for greenie, one for par) his score would move up to minus seven. Likewise, if a player has a 27 handicap, he will begin play with plus nine points and go up from there. Each golfer keeps track of his points. Once earned, points cannot be lost. For example, a player starts at +9 and makes par on the first hole thus earning 2 points for a +11. Even if he makes 17 straight bogeys. he will still finish with+11 points. As always, the team score will be aggregate of the scores earned by all the team members.

REGISTRATION FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE IF A PLAYER CANCELS AFTER PLAYER ROSTERS HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED TO THE GOLF COURSE (NORMALLY SEVEN DAYS PRIOR TO THE EVENT)

Participation by Retired Men's Club members only – sorry, no guests. Carts are required for all players at all events (included in entry fee). Proper golf attire required – collared shirts/no jeans.

Golfers should arrive at the course for check-in at least 45 minutes prior to start time

Entry fee balance due (normally \$40) will be collected by team captains on the day of the event. Cash only; no checks accepted.

In the unlikely event that the number of registered players exceeds a course's capacity, players will be assigned in the order that registrations were received. Standby lists will be maintained as necessary.

When possible, team captains will notify team members if play is cancelled due to weather. If no call was received and there is still doubt, players may call the club's pro shop for status of play.

Registration fees will not be refunded due to weather if the course is open for play.

After a roster is submitted, if an emergency or other circumstance prevents a golfer from playing, the player should notify the Event Chairman and his team captain as soon as possible. If it is the morning of the event, the player should call the course pro shop and ask the person answering to inform our Event Chairman of his change in status.


