

Habitat for Humanity of Cape Cod is a non-profit organization with an overall mission of building homes, changing lives, and preserving community. Partnering with families, Habitat has developed over 170 affordable homes on Cape Cod. With the support of Habitat and community involvement, Habitat homeowners achieve the strength, stability and self-reliance they need to build a better life for themselves and their families.

Additionally, Habitat has two Restore home improvement stores (Yarmouth & Falmouth) and donation centers that sell new and gently used home goods to the public at a fraction of retail price. Proceeds are used to help support the building of houses in our community.

Ms. Irving and Ms. Cronin will provide greater insight into Habitat's fine work and the positive impact on our Cape Cod community.

Finally, as a means of further involving the community, Habitat offers Volunteer Service Days enabling individuals to participate in a house building project. We are hoping that 10 to 12 Retired Men's Club members will be interested in participating in a Service Day, which is a very rewarding experience.

How RMC Golf does things



GOLF EVENTS:

Long before a golf event takes place, the Golf Committee solicits area golf courses for pricing of an outing.

Once a list of potential courses is developed, the Committee reviews pricing scenarios and selects the courses to be played in any given season (eg. Spring, Fall). At that point a registration form (on the RMC website) is produced.

We have selected five courses for the Spring, and the cost to play will be \$70 per event. While the committee works hard to keep the prices low, many courses have raised their event fees, some to the point where we will not currently consider it.

So let's explain the fee charged:

The <u>total</u> an individual is charged <u>for an event</u> is comprised of the fees we are being charged by golf courses, prizes, administrative expenses (office supplies, postage, etc.), plus an amount to subsidize the charged fees at more expensive locations. This amount may, or may not, be the amount an individual would have to pay if he went to the course on his own to play. Typically, in any given season, there is one event that costs significantly more than the fee we charge to play, and one event is less than our charge. (Hence subsidizing the more expensive event.)

YOUR CLUB DUES:

As an RMC member that plays golf, paying \$20 annual dues, a portion of your dues (an average of \$10 per player) is supplied to the Golf Committee - to help offset the above golfing charges.

In addition the Club pays the \$6 software fee per person playing golf. So . . . currently, your net dues are \$4 per year (\$20 minus \$10, minus \$6) - subject to future change. Other portions of the annual dues also go to subsidize the annual holiday luncheon, bowling, and other events that he RMC may put on.

WHAT A DEAL!!!

RMC Golf

One week from today (April 1st) marks the beginning of the RMC Golf 2023 Spring Registration. The first event is at Ocean Edge on May 1st.

This week you can go to the RMC website (Link: Home retired-mensclub.com) select SPORTS and then GOLF. All of the five (5) events detail sheets are posted with dates, times, formats etc. This will give you the time to determine which events you will be able to play before registration begins. You can then return next week to the same site and select Registration, fill out the form, hit submit and then mail in the registration fee of \$20 per event selected to the post office box indicated. After you register, you can use the **Cancel/Change/Add** form also at the same location as the Registration form on the website to make any late changes

Remember your registration is not complete until both the form and fee are received. You also must have paid your 2023 membership fee, so get it in now. Worse case is you can pay it at the Thursday, April 13th RMC meeting.

The long term forecast for the 1st Week in May is in the low 60's. However, this is the Cape, so who knows, but we can hope.

We are looking forward to getting back to the number of players we saw pre-COVID


