### January 2019 Program

Cape Wildlife Center Helping People, Helping Wildlife



When: Thursday, January 10, 2019

**Who**: Zak Mertz, Executive Director Cape Wildlife Center, Barnstable

As we have heard with past speakers, Cape Cod has a collection of unique community-based services dedicated to the promotion, preservation, and health of wild animals.

While it has been said that the majority of the States give lip service to this commendable undertaking, the Cape and Commonwealth take this challenge very seriously.

This talk will cover the state of wildlife and biodiversity on Cape Cod, as well as some of the common afflictions and diseases typically seen in patients at the Cape Wildlife Center. We will also cover what to do if you find a wild animal and some helpful things you can do to help wild animals thrive in your ownbackyard.

Zak Mertz is the Executive Director of the Cape Wildlife Center and the Assistant Director of the New England Wildlife Center. Zak has worked in wildlife hospital management as a veterinary technician for the past seven years. Zak holds a Masters of Science from UMASS Boston with a concentration in hydrology.


