
NEXT MEETING

Oyster Farming On CapeCod

Many of our members engage in the activity of digging (harvesting) oysters and clams and their rewards are plentiful. Many more of our members enjoy tasting the succulent morsels raw or prepared in a variety of ways. High quality oysters in particular are synonymous with Cape Cod, and highly sought after!

Our speaker for our final meeting of the season is <u>John Lowell</u>, co owner of <u>East Dennis Oyster Farm</u>. John and his wife, Stephanie, who is also a CPA, have been farming oysters since 2003. They each applied for, and were awarded, their own one acre aquaculture grant which they have farmed since.

Therein lies the difference between what we do when we schlep out in the water with our rake and basket digging for oysters and hopefully producing a basketful as the reward. They are professional farmers, not fishermen, and members of the aquaculture industry.

Data from the Cooperative Extension Service of Barnstable County shows that in 2015 there were 227 shellfish farms in Barnstable County. Over 19 million oysters were harvested with a value of \$11.3 million. Cape Cod has been at the forefront of the aquaculture economy for countless generations.

In addition to being a huge economic asset, oyster populations provide enormous ecosystem services including water quality maintenance and nitrogen removal from the water where the oysters reside.

Oysters and their specific flavor are site specific. No matter what your preference, they bring tremendous satisfaction to the taste buds, the environment, and the economy.


