Aquacultural Research Corporation

Aquacultural Research Corporation was founded in 1960 on Cape Cod with a mission to support the shellfish industry of Cape Cod and beyond.

In 2015 the A.R.C. Hatchery, a shellfish hatchery that has operated at the mouth of Chase Garden Creek in Dennis for more than 50 years, took on a new structure and ownership with a group of private investors who, in many cases, have a stake in the fishing industry. A total of over 4.5 million dollars was spent on a new state-of-the - art facility and equipment.

Today, it is an unmatched leader in spawning a variety of shellfish including Eastern Oyster, Quahog, Surf Clam, and Bay Scallop, producing millions of animals per year for local, regional, and national customers.

In the area of research, A.R.C. scientists are involved in research projects directed at increasing survival rates and developing new species for aquacultural production.

Our speaker presenting the A.R.C.Hatchery story is Rick Sawyer, Sales/Marketing Manager.






